On 10/3/08 at approximately 2311 hours, a call to police was made to report an illegally parked speed photo van in the area of 14th Pl and Priest Dr. The complainant, D.T. Arne son, called for police after he observed a speed photo van parked near a fire hydrant on Priest Dr just south of 14th Pl. D stated that while he was "demonstrating" his right to free speech by holding a brightly colored sign reading "SCAMERA" near the van, the operator of the speed photo van, Corey Fleetwood, exited the van, approached him on foot, grabbed the sign from his grasp, and threw it to the ground. D related that the sign was damaged during this incident and requested a police report. It was explained to D and Corey that a police report would be taken to document the incident.

On 10/3/08 at approximately 2311 hours, I was dispatched to the area of 14th Pl and Priest Dr in reference a report of an illegally parked speed photo van. The information provided to me by dispatch stated that van was parked in front of a fire hydrant on Priest Dr just south of 14th Pl. Upon arrival, I observed a speed photo van parked facing southbound on the west side of southbound Priest Dr. The van was south of 14th Pl and parked between the sidewalk and right curb of Priest Dr on a dirt patch. Priest Dr appeared to be under construction and there were traffic control barricades dividing all southbound and northbound lanes. The road surface of Priest Dr was rough, uneven, and appeared to be "milled" down as part of ongoing road construction. Traffic on Priest Dr was moderate to light at the time of my arrival.

Standing outside of the van near the driver side door, I observed a subject later identified as (M) Corey Fleetwood. Standing to the rear of the vehicle (just north), I observed three subjects later identified as (M) D T Arneson, (M) Jasmine P , and (M) Sarah W .

I positioned my vehicle on southbound Priest Dr, exited, and contacted D . D related that he had called for police after he noticed that the speed photo van was parked too close to a fire hydrant. D stated that he noticed this while he was standing outside near the van, holding a sign to demonstrate his opposition to the speed photo van. D then walked me to the front of the van where I observed a yellow fire hydrant. The van was parked parallel to the fire hydrant and approximately 6 feet north. D asked me if this would be considered a parking violation. When questioned, D related that the van was running and manned while it sat parked near the hydrant. I explained to D that since the van was running and manned, that I would not issue a parking citation because the van could be moved quickly if the event of an emergency. D related that he understood my discretion on parking violations and stated that he understood my reasoning for not issuing a citation.

D then advised me that prior to my arrival, he was standing approximately 6-7 feet north of the van holding a Styrofoam sign that read "SCAMERA". D related that he was holding the sign and facing northbound in "demonstration" to his disapproval of the speed photo van. D stated that he had been demonstrating for approximately 30 minutes when Sarah and Jasmine approached him on foot. D related that he did not know Sarah and Jasmine and advised me that they had seen him demonstrating and wished to join him. D stated that he, Jasmine, and Sarah took turns holding the sign while standing near the van. At one point, D mentioned that he had told Jasmine and Sarah that the operators of the speed photo vans were "not nice people".

D related that they continued to demonstrate for approximately 30 more minutes when the van operator, Corey, exited the driver side of the van and approached him. D stated that Corey began walking towards him quickly in an aggressive manner while asking him, "What's the problem?". D related that as Corey walked towards him, he began to back peddle northbound away

from Corey. D stated that he took approximately four steps back before Corey reached out and grabbed the sign from his grasp. D related that Corey then threw the sign onto the ground, causing minor damage to the painted surface of the sign.

D stated that Corey was very upset upon exiting the van. D advised me that Corey calmed down after throwing the sign and stood by to wait for police.

A visual inspection of the sign revealed minor damage to the surface paint on right side and right bottom corner. I also observed similar damage to the painted surface of the sign on the left side near the middle. D related that the damage on the right side and right bottom corner had been caused by Corey throwing the sign to the ground, but did not mention how the damage to the left side near the middle had occurred. D estimated the value of the sign, including materials and labor, at \$35.00. D related that he desired a police report and full prosecution. Digital photos of the sign were taken and impounded as evidence at 1875 E Apache Blvd. At the request of D , the sign was also impounded at 1875 E Apache Blvd as evidence.

I then conducted separate interviews with Sarah and Jasmine. Both Sarah and Jasmine advised me that they were together and driving south on Priest Dr when they saw D standing near the van with the sign. Sarah and Jasmine related that out of curiosity, they parked, walked over and began talking with D about the demonstration. Sarah and Jasmine stated that they both joined in on the demonstration by holding the sign and dancing as passing vehicles drove by. Sarah and Jasmine related that they did this for approximately 30 minutes before observing Corey exit the van and approach D on foot. Sarah and Jasmine stated that D was standing just north of the van when Corey began to walk towards him. Sarah and Jasmine related that Corey was asking D , "What's your problem?" and "What's your plan?". Sarah and Jasmine stated that D began to back peddle away from Corey when Corey reached out and pulled the sign away from D 's grasp. Sarah and Jasmine related Corey pulled the sign away from D , and then threw the sign onto the ground.

During these interviews, Jasmine stated that at no point did Corey make any verbal threats to assault or harm D , and Sarah mentioned that D had described the speed photo van operators as "not nice people". Sarah also mentioned that D had "possibly" blocked the view if the van cameras during this demonstration. Digital audio recordings were made and impounded at 1875 E Apache Blvd.

A separate interview with Corey was conducted during which he related the following information; Corey stated that he was inside of the speed photo van working when he observed D , Jasmine, and Sarah standing near the rear of his van holding a sign. Corey stated that Sarah and Jasmine were dancing around and yelling "whoop whoop" at passing vehicles. Corey related that the passing vehicles were honking, speeding off, and spinning their tires as they passed the van and demonstration. Corey stated that it appeared as if the passing vehicles were driving erratically as a result of the demonstration. Corey related that this was causing a potentially hazardous situation along Priest Dr.

Corey stated that he observed D standing approximately 6-7 feet north of his van and blocking the camera with his body and the sign. Corey related that it appeared as if D was intentionally positioning himself in front of the camera to block the view of the van cameras.

Corey stated that he called for police and then exited the van. Corey related that he approached D while asking him what he was doing. Corey stated that he told D that he was trying to do his job and that the cameras were unable to capture photographs of speeding vehicles when he stood in front of the vehicle. Corey related that he then reached out with his right hand and grabbed the sign from D's grasp. Corey stated that he placed the sign on the ground and advised D that he had called for police. Corey related that he was unaware of any damage to the sign as a result of this incident. A digital audio recording of this interview was made and impounded at 1875 E Apache Blvd.

Both Corey and D were informed that a long form report would be written to document the incident. Both Corey and D were provided with the report number, my name and ID, and the phone number to the Tempe Police Department via blue cards.
